

Descendants of Jane Thompson

Generation One

1. Jane Thompson, daughter of Nathan Thompson and Esther Black, was born on 24 April 1797 in Rutherford County, North Carolina. Since her father was listed in the 1790 Rutherford County census and purchased land there in 1797, it is believed that Jane was born in said county.^{1,2}

On 4 August 1800 Jane Thompson was likely a free white female under the age ten listed in the household of Nathan Thompson in the census of Buncombe County, North Carolina³

On 6 August 1810 Jane Thompson was likely a free white female of ten through fifteen listed in the household of Nathan Thompson in the census of Haywood County, North Carolina⁴

Jane Thompson and James Sellers are estimated to have married circa 1820; they possibly married in Haywood County, North Carolina, where they lived. Their marriage bond does not survive.⁵

On 7 August 1820 Jane Thompson was possibly the free white female between sixteen and under twenty-six listed in the household of Nathan Beers Thompson in the census of Haywood County, North Carolina⁶

On 1 June 1830 Jane Thompson was likely a free white female of thirty and under forty listed in the household of James Sellers in the census of Haywood County, North Carolina⁷

On 1 June 1840 Jane Thompson was likely a free white female of forty and under fifty listed in the household of James Sellers in the census of Macon County, North Carolina⁸

On 2 August 1850 in the census she was listed as the head of household in St. Francois County, Missouri. She was listed as Jane Sellers, age 54, female, born in North Carolina, and not able to read or write. The household included Margaret Minerva Sellers, James R. Sellers, John W. Sellers, Emily F. Ross, Sarah Jane Ellis Ross, Martha Verlincha Franklin Ross, Justianna J. Sellers, and Ruth Elizabeth Sellers.⁹

On 16 June 1860 in the census, she was listed as the head of household at Northern Division in Tippah County, Mississippi. She was listed as Jane Sellers, age 64, female, white, and born in North Carolina. The household included Justianna J. Sellers, Ruth Elizabeth Sellers, and Sarah Jane Ellis Ross.¹⁰

On 13 September 1870 in the census, she was listed in the household of William W. Bailey at Range 4, Township 4, in Tippah County, Mississippi. She was listed as Jane Selars, age 74, female, white, at home, and born in North Carolina.¹¹

Jane Thompson died in Ripley, Tippah County, Mississippi. She died sometime after she was enumerated on 13 September in the 1870 census.¹²

James Sellers is estimated to have been born from 1791 to 1800 in a currently unknown place; he, however, lived in Haywood County, North Carolina, which may or may not be where he was born.

On 7 August 1820 James Sellers was possibly the free white male of eighteen and under twenty-six listed in the household of Nathan Beers Thompson in the 1820 census of Haywood County, North Carolina¹³

On 1 June 1830 he was listed as the head of family in the 1830 census of Haywood County, North Carolina. The household of James Sellers included one free white male under 5 (John W. Sellers, born 1828), one free white male age 5 and under 10 (Nathan B. Sellers, born 1821), one free white male age 30 and under 40 (James Sellers), one free white female age 5 and under 10 (Margaret Minerva Sellers, born 1824), and one free white female age 30 and under 40: (Jane Thompson Sellers), for a total of 5 in the household. They were residing directly next to Jane's father Nathan Thompson.¹⁴

On 1 June 1840 he was listed as the head of family in the 1840 census of Macon County, North Carolina.

The household of James Sellars included one free white male age five and under ten (James Sellers, age about 9), two free white males 10–14 (John Sellers, age 12, and an unknown son), one free white males age 40–49 (James Sellers), two free white females under age 5 (Justiana Sellers, age 5, and Rutha E. Sellers, age 1), one free white female age 5–9 (Margaret Minerva Sellers, age 16), and one free white female age 40–50 (Jane Thompson Sellars), for a total of eight in the household. One person was employed in agriculture and one manufacture. He was listed next to Margaret Sellars and near John Sellers. Son Nathan B. Sellers, age 19, was not listed in this household.¹⁵

James Sellers died before 1850.

The six known children of Jane Thompson and James Sellers were as follows:

- + 2. i. Nathan B. Sellers was born on 4 June 1821 in Haywood County, North Carolina.
- + 3. ii. Margaret Minerva Sellers was born between 1824 and 1828 in North Carolina.
- + 4. iii. John W. Sellers was born in 1828 in Haywood County, North Carolina.
- + 5. iv. James Manson Sellers was born in 1831 in North Carolina.
- 6. v. Justianna J. Sellers was born in July 1835 in Macon County, North Carolina.

On 1 June 1840 Justianna J. Sellers was likely a free white female under five listed in the household of James Sellers in the census of Macon County, North Carolina¹⁶

She was enumerated in the 1850 census in the household of Jane Thompson on 2 August 1850 in St. Francois County, Missouri. She was listed as Justina Sellers, age 15, female, born in North Carolina, and as having attended school within the past year.¹⁷

On 16 June 1860 in the census, she as was enumerated in the household of Jane Thompson at Northern Division in Tippah County, Mississippi. She was listed as Jettie Sellers, age 23, female, white, a school teacher, and born in North Carolina.¹⁸

On 13 September 1870 in the census, she was listed in the household of William W. Bailey at Range 4, Township 4, in Tippah County, Mississippi. She was listed as Jetty S. Selars, age 35, female, white, at home, and born in North Carolina.¹⁹ Justianna J. Sellers, age 39, and M. C. Gossett were married on 22 June 1875 in Tippah County, Mississippi.

On 16 June 1900 in the census, she was listed as the sister-in-law of William W. Bailey in Atkins, Pope County, Arkansas. She was listed as Jettie Gossett, white, female, born in July 1835, age 64, a widow and mother of no children and none living, and born in North Carolina with both parents born in North Carolina; she could read, write, and speak English.²⁰

In the 1910 census she as Justianna J. Sellers was listed as the aunt of John Wesley Thompson Bailey on 26 April 1910 in Dover Street, Atkins, Pope County, Arkansas. She was listed as Jestiania J. Gossett, white, female, age 74, a widow with no children, none living, and born in North Carolina with both parents born in North Carolina; she had no occupation and could read, write, and speak English.²¹

Justianna J. Sellers probably died before 1920 in a currently unknown place; she lived in Atkins, Pope County, Arkansas (which may or may not be where she died).

- + 7. vi. Ruth Elizabeth Sellers was born on 17 September 1839 in Rutherford County, North Carolina. Her name is listed as Ruth Elizabeth Sellers apparently on her son John Wesley Thompson Bailey's headstone.

Generation Two

2. Nathan B. Sellers was born on 4 June 1821 in Haywood County, North Carolina.

On 1 June 1830 Nathan B. Sellers was likely a free white male of five years and under ten listed in the household of James Sellers in the census of Haywood County, North Carolina²²

On 1 June 1840 Nathan B. Sellers was likely a free white male of ten and under fifteen listed in the household of James Sellers in the census of Macon County, North Carolina²³ Nathan B. Sellers and Lucinda Childers were married circa 1844 in Tennessee.

Nathan B. Sellers was not identified in the 1850 census in Missouri.^{24,25}

On 3 July 1860 in the census, he was listed as the head of household in Ste. Genevieve Township, Ste. Genevieve County, Missouri. He was listed as N. B. Selleirs, age 38, male, a teacher common schools with a personal estate valued at \$100, and born in North Carolina. The household included Lucinda Childers and William James Sellers. The post office was on Plank Road.²⁶

On 31 July 1870 in the census, he was enumerated as the head of household in Union Township, Ste. Genevieve County, Missouri. He was listed as N. B. Sellers, age 50, male, white, a teacher with real estate valued at \$600 and personal estate valued at \$320, and born in North Carolina; he could not read and write [*sic*] and was a male citizen of the U.S. age 21 years and upwards. The household included: Lucinda Childers, William James Sellers, and Martha Lucinda Pigg.²⁷

Nathan B. Sellers died on 22 February 1871 in Union Township, Ste. Genevieve County, Missouri.

Lucinda Childers was born on 18 September 1818 in Tennessee.

On 3 July 1860 in the census, she was enumerated in the household of Nathan B. Sellers in Ste. Genevieve Township, Ste. Genevieve County, Missouri. She was listed as Lucy Selleirs, age 41, female, and born in Tennessee.²⁸

On 31 July 1870 in the census, she was listed in the household of Nathan B. Sellers in Union Township, Ste. Genevieve County, Missouri. She was listed as Lucinda Sellers, age 51, female, white, a house keeper, born in Tennessee, and not able to read or write.²⁹

Lucinda Childers died on 3 January 1889 in Ste. Genevieve County, Missouri. She was buried in Pigg Cemetery in Ste. Genevieve County, Missouri.

The only known child of Nathan B. Sellers and Lucinda Childers was:

- + 8. i. William James Sellers was born on 17 March 1845 in Tennessee.

3. Margaret Minerva Sellers was born between 1824 and 1828 in North Carolina.

On 1 June 1830 Margaret Minerva Sellers was likely a free white female of five and under ten listed in the household of James Sellers in the census of Haywood County, North Carolina³⁰

On 1 June 1840 Margaret Minerva Sellers was likely a free white female of five and under ten listed in the household of James Sellers in the census of Macon County, North Carolina³¹ Margaret Minerva Sellers and Oliver Franklin Ross were married on 15 July 1844 in Coffee County, Tennessee.

She was enumerated in the 1850 census in the household of Jane Thompson on 2 August 1850 in St. Francois County, Missouri. She was listed as Minerva Ross, age 24, female, and born in North Carolina.³²

Margaret Minerva Sellers and William H. Sanders were married on 14 March 1858 in Tippah County, Mississippi.

On 16 August 1860 in the census, she was enumerated in the household of William H. Sanders at Southern Subdivision in Tippah County, Mississippi. She was listed as Margaret M. Saunders, age 32, female, and born in North Carolina.³³

Margaret Minerva Sellers died in 1900 in Union County, Mississippi.

The two known children of Margaret Minerva Sellers and Oliver Franklin Ross were as follows:

- 9. i. Sarah Jane Ellis Ross. Sarah Jane Ellis Ross and Joseph B. Purnell were married. She was born in 1847 in Tennessee.

On 16 August 1860 in the census, he as was enumerated in the household of William H. Sanders at Southern Subdivision in Tippah County, Mississippi. She was listed as

Sarah J. E. Ross, age 13, female, born in Tennessee, and as having attended school within the past year.³⁴

Joseph B. Purnell was born in 1830 in South Carolina.

+ 10. ii. Martha Verlincha Franklin Ross was born in 1849 in Tennessee.

William H. Sanders was born circa 1820 in Kentucky.

On 16 August 1860 in the census, he was listed as the head of household at Southern Subdivision in Tippah County, Mississippi. He was listed as William H. Saunders, age 40, male, a farmer with real estate valued at \$800 and personal estate at \$750, and born in Kentucky. The household included Margaret Minerva Sellers, Justiana E. Sanders, Sarah Jane Ellis Ross, and Martha Verlincha Franklin Ross. His children from his first marriage were also listed.³⁵

William H. Sanders died on 29 July 1867 in Tippah County, Mississippi.

The only known child of Margaret Minerva Sellers and William H. Sanders was:

11. i. Justiana E. Sanders was born in 1859 in Tippah County, Mississippi.

On 16 August 1860 in the census, she as was enumerated in the household of William H. Sanders at Southern Subdivision in Tippah County, Mississippi. She was listed as Justiana E. Saunders, age 1, female, and born in Mississippi.³⁶

4. John W. Sellers was born in 1828 in Haywood County, North Carolina.

On 1 June 1830 John W. Sellers was likely a free white male under five years of age listed in the household of James Sellers in the census of Haywood County, North Carolina³⁷

On 1 June 1840 John W. Sellers was likely a free white male of ten and under fifteen listed in the household of James Sellers in the census of Macon County, North Carolina³⁸ John W. Sellers and Emily F. Ross were married in 1849 in of in Coffee County, Tennessee.

He was enumerated in the 1850 census in the household of Jane Thompson on 2 August 1850 in St. Francois County, Missouri. He was listed as John Sellers, age 22, male, a laborer, and born in North Carolina.³⁹

Emily F. Ross was born at of in Coffee County, Tennessee.

The only known child of John W. Sellers and Emily F. Ross was:

12. i. James R. Sellers was born in 1849 in Tennessee.

He was enumerated in the 1850 census in the household of Jane Thompson on 2 August 1850 in St. Francois County, Missouri. He was listed as James R. Sellers, age 8 months, and born in Missouri.⁴⁰

5. James Manson Sellers was born in 1831 in North Carolina.

On 1 June 1840 James Manson Sellers was likely a free white male of five and under ten listed in the household of James Sellers in the census of Macon County, North Carolina⁴¹

James Manson Sellers and Mary E. (--?--) are estimated to have married circa 1849; they possibly married in Coffee County, Tennessee, where they lived.

On 9 October 1850 in the census he was listed as the head of household in 6th Civil District in Coffee County, Tennessee. He was listed as Manson Sellers, age 19, male, white, a farmer, born in North Carolina, and married within the year. The household included Mary E. (--?--) and William J. Sellers.⁴²

On 21 June 1860 in the census, he was listed as the head of household at 7th Civil District in Coffee County, Tennessee. He was listed as J. M. Callars, age 32, male, a farmer with real estate valued at \$500 and personal estate at \$125, born in North Carolina, and a person over the age of 21 who could not read or write. The household included Mary E. (--?--), William J. Sellers, Alpha Justana or Jane Sellers, Sarah E. Sellers, John W. Sellers, and Martha M. Sellers. The post office was at Hillsboro.⁴³ James Manson Sellers and Mary Ellen Anderson were married on 20 October 1864 in Coffee County, Tennessee.

On 24 June 1870 in the census, he was enumerated as the head of household at 3rd Civil District in Christian

County, Kentucky. He was listed as James M. Sellers, age 39, male, white, a farmer with real estate valued at \$1,400 and personal estate at \$700, born in North Carolina, and a citizen of the U.S. age 21 years and upwards. The household included: Mary Ellen Anderson, Sarah E. Sellers, Amanda E. Arnold, John W. Sellers, Martha M. Sellers, Elizabeth Arnold, and Sarah Jane Arnold.⁴⁴

On 14 June 1880 in the census, he was listed as head of household in Richwood Township, McDonald County, Missouri. He was listed as James M. Sellars, white, male, age 49, and born in South Carolina [*sic*]; the birthplace of his parents was not given Enumerated with him were Mary Ellen Anderson and Nathan Elmore Sellers.⁴⁵

Mary E. (--?--) was born in 1829 in Tennessee.

She as was enumerated in the 1850 census in the household of James Manson Sellers on 9 October 1850 in 6th Civil District, Coffee County, Tennessee. She was listed as Mary Sellers, age 21, female, white, and born in Tennessee.⁴⁶

On 21 June 1860 in the census, she was enumerated in the household of James Manson Sellers at 7th Civil District in Coffee County, Tennessee. She was listed as May E. Callars, age 33, female, a domestic, and born in Tennessee.⁴⁷

Mary E. (--?--) died before 20 October 1864 at of in Coffee County, Tennessee.

The five known children of James Manson Sellers and Mary E. (--?--) were as follows:

On 21 June 1860 in the census, he as was enumerated in the household of James Manson Sellers at 7th Civil District in Coffee County, Tennessee. He was listed as William J. Callars, age 10, male, born in Tennessee, and as having attended school within the past year.⁴⁹

15. iii. Sarah E. Sellers was born in 1854 in Coffee County, Tennessee.
On 21 June 1860 in the census, she as was enumerated in the household of James Manson Sellers at 7th Civil District in Coffee County, Tennessee. She was listed as Sarah E. Callars, age 6, female, born in Tennessee, and as having attended school within the past year.⁵⁰
On 24 June 1870 in the census, she was listed in the household of James Manson Sellers at 3rd Civil District in Christian County, Kentucky. She was listed as Sarah E. Sellers, age 17, female, white, born in Tennessee, and as having attended school within the past year.⁵¹
16. iv. John W. Sellers was born in 1856 in Coffee County, Tennessee.
On 21 June 1860 in the census, he as was enumerated in the household of James Manson Sellers at 7th Civil District in Coffee County, Tennessee. He was listed as John W. Callars, age 4, male, and born in Tennessee.⁵²
On 24 June 1870 in the census, he was listed in the household of James Manson Sellers at 3rd Civil District in Christian County, Kentucky. He was listed as John W. Sellers, age 14, male, white, born in Tennessee, and as having attended school within the past year.⁵³
17. v. Martha M. Sellers was born in 1858 in Coffee County, Tennessee.
On 21 June 1860 in the census, she as was enumerated in the household of James Manson Sellers at 7th Civil District in Coffee County, Tennessee. She was listed as

Martha M. Callars, age 2, female, and born in Tennessee.⁵⁴

On 24 June 1870 in the census, she was listed in the household of James Manson Sellers at 3rd Civil District in Christian County, Kentucky. She was listed as Martha Sellers, age 10, female, white, born in Tennessee, and as having attended school within the past year.⁵⁵

Mary Ellen Anderson was born in 1835 in Tennessee. She and John B. Arnold obtained a marriage license on 30 September 1854 in Coffee County, Tennessee.⁵⁶

Mary Ellen Anderson and John B. Arnold were married on 1 October 1854 in Coffee County, Tennessee. She was listed as Mary E. Anderson. They were married by John Charles, J.P.⁵⁷

On 24 June 1870 in the census, she was listed in the household of James Manson Sellers at 3rd Civil District in Christian County, Kentucky. She was listed as Mary E. Sellers, age 35, female, white, and born in Tennessee.⁵⁸

On 14 June 1880 in the census, she was listed as wife of James Manson Sellers in Richwood Township, McDonald County, Missouri. She was listed as Mary E. Sellars, white, female, age 44, married, and born in Tennessee; the birthplaces of her parents was not given.⁵⁹

The only known child of James Manson Sellers and Mary Ellen Anderson was:

- + 18. i. Nathan Elmore Sellers was born on 19 November 1865 in Coffee County, Tennessee.

7. Ruth Elizabeth Sellers was born on 17 September 1839 in Rutherford County, North Carolina. Her name is listed as Ruth Elizabeth Sellers apparently on her son John Wesley Thompson Bailey's headstone.

On 1 June 1840 Ruth Elizabeth Sellers was likely a free white female under five listed in the household of James Sellers in the census of Macon County, North Carolina⁶⁰

She was enumerated in the 1850 census in the household of Jane Thompson on 2 August 1850 in St. Francois County, Missouri. She was listed as Ruth E. Sellers, age 9, female, born in North Carolina, and as having attended school within the past year.⁶¹

On 16 June 1860 in the census, she as was enumerated in the household of Jane Thompson at Northern Division in Tippah County, Mississippi. She was listed as Ruth Sellers, age 30, female, white, born in North Carolina, and as having attended school within the past year.⁶²

Ruth Elizabeth Sellers and William W. Bailey were married in 1865 in Tippah County, Mississippi.

On 13 September 1870 in the census, she was listed in the household of William W. Bailey at Range 4, Township 4, in Tippah County, Mississippi. She was listed as Ruth E. Bailey, age 31, female, white, keeping house, and born in North Carolina.⁶³

On 16 June 1900 in the census, she was listed as the wife of William W. Bailey in Atkins, Pope County, Arkansas. She was listed as Ruth E. Baily, white, female, born in September 1839, age 60, married for 35 years, the mother of 3 children, all living, and born in North Carolina with both parents born in North Carolina; she could read, write, and speak English.⁶⁴

Ruth Elizabeth Sellers probably died before 1910 in a currently unknown place; she lived in Atkins, Pope County, Arkansas (which may or may not be where she died).

William W. Bailey was born on 27 June 1834 in near Springhill, Tippah County, Mississippi.^{65,66}

On 13 September 1870 in the census, he was enumerated as the head of household at Range 4, Township 4, in Tippah County, Mississippi. He was listed was W. W. Bailey, age 36, male, white, a farmer with real estate valued at \$1,000 and personal estate at \$462, born in Mississippi, and a male citizen of the United States age 21 years and upwards. The household included: Ruth Elizabeth Sellers, Edmund I. Bailey, George Sellers Bailey, Jane Thompson, and Justianna J. Sellers.⁶⁷

On 16 June 1900 in the census, he as was listed as the head of household in Atkins, Pope County, Arkansas. He was listed as William Baily, white, male, born in June 1834, age 65, married for 35 years, and born in Mississippi with both parents born in North Carolina; he could read, write, and speak English, was a cotton

buyer, and owned a house free of mortgage. The household included Ruth Elizabeth Sellers, John Wesley Thompson Bailey, Ruth Elizabeth Bailey, George Edmund Bailey, and Justianna J. Sellers.⁶⁸

William W. Bailey probably died before 1910 in a currently unknown place; he lived in Atkins, Pope County, Arkansas (which may or may not be where he died).

The three known children of Ruth Elizabeth Sellers and William W. Bailey were as follows:

8. William James Sellers was born on 17 March 1845 in Tennessee.

On 3 July 1860 in the census, he as was enumerated in the household of Nathan B. Sellers in Ste. Genevieve Township, Ste. Genevieve County, Missouri. He was listed as William James Selleirs, age 15, male, a laborer, born in Tennessee, and as having attended school within the past year.⁶⁹

William James Sellers, age 24, and Martha Lucinda Pigg were married in September 1869 in Ste. Genevieve County, Missouri.

On 31 July 1870 in the census, he was listed in the household of Nathan B. Sellers in Union Township, Ste. Genevieve County, Missouri. He was listed as William Sellers, age 25, male, white, born in Tennessee, not able to read or write, and a male citizen of the U.S. age 21 years and upwards; he had married in September of the previous year.⁷⁰

William James Sellers died on 22 December 1875.

Martha Lucinda Pigg was born in 1819 in Tennessee.

The only known child of William James Sellers and Martha Lucinda Pigg was:

- 22. i. Martha Lucinda Sellers was born on 10 December 1871 in Ste. Genevieve County, Missouri. Martha Lucinda Sellers, age 17, and Robert Lee Hood, age 26, were married on 13 August 1889.

Martha Lucinda Sellers died on 4 June 1939 at Barnes Hospital in St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri. She was buried on 7 June 1939 in Pigg Cemetery in Ste. Genevieve County, Missouri.

Robert Lee Hood was born on 10 December 1862.

Martha Verlincha Franklin Ross died on 20 July 1913.
